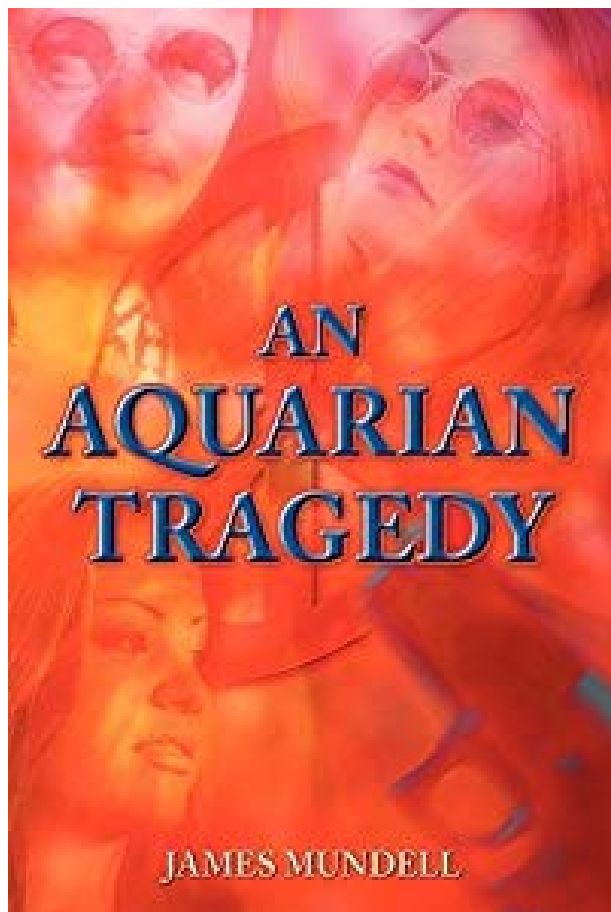


# An Aquarian Tragedy
